- Tracks participants' progress in training programs
 - Data required for the United States Department of Labor (USDOL)
 - Data for internal analyses

Types of Data Tracked

- Case Notes
 - Shows interaction between case managers and participants
- Employment / Internships
 - Verify employment outcomes

- Track quarterly and annual progress of CareerPATH program for the USDOL
- Database developed to house and organize participant data

Flexible and Customizable

- Database acts as a framework for different training programs
- Modified to meet training program requirements and policies
- Program/Campus specific information can be added as needed

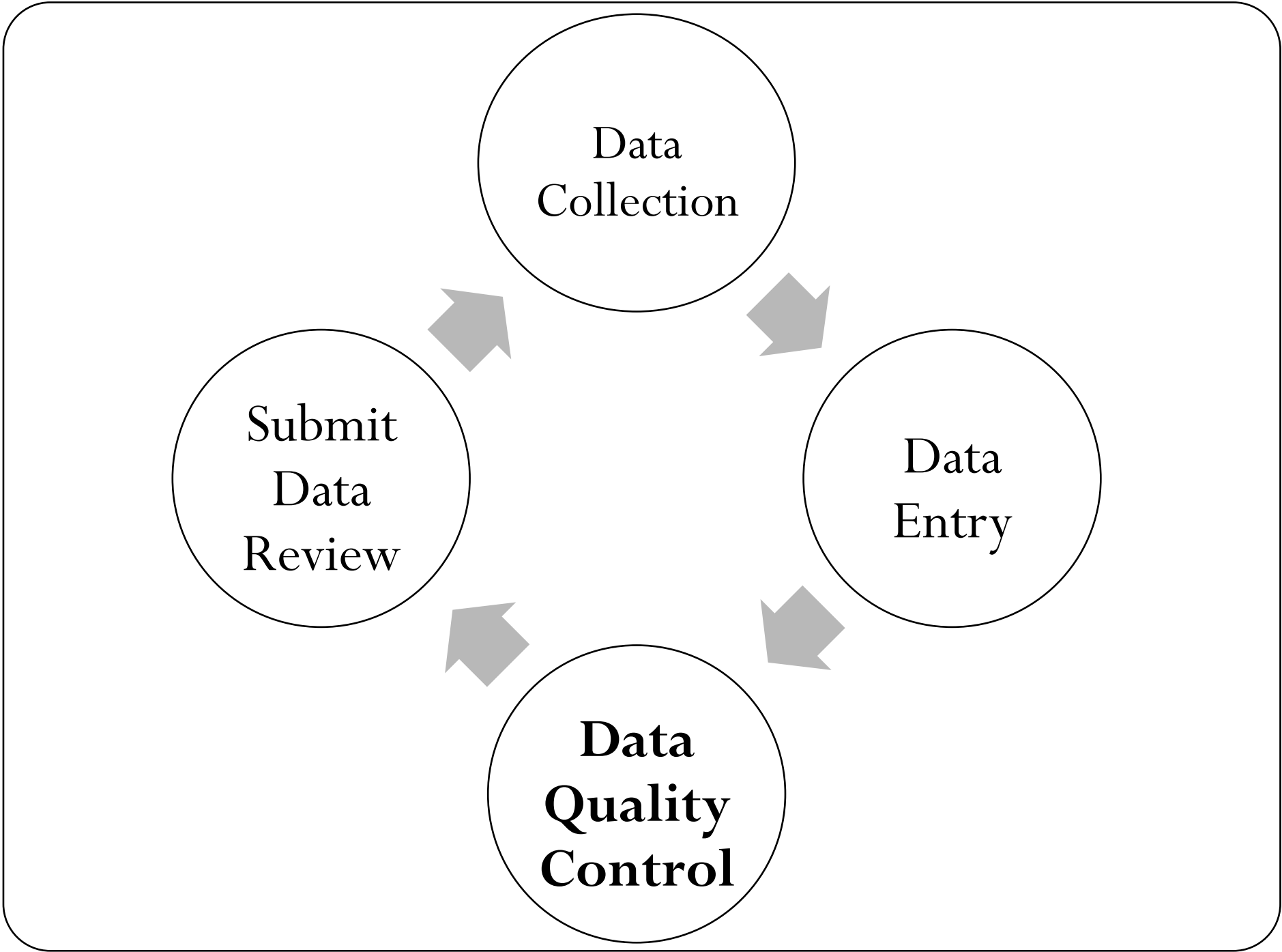

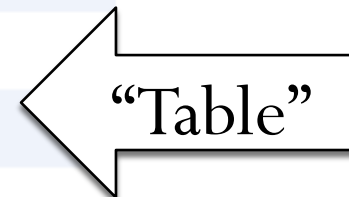

Steps for Data Quality Control

1. Completeness
2. Consistency
3. Accuracy
4. Duplication

Completeness

- Simple → Missing or usability
 - Data element in same format for a variable.
 - Example: Email address include “@”; Telephone numbers include 9 digits
- Complex → Check whether set of variables include complete information
 - Check whether multiple pieces of information entered into database is complete
 - Example: Start Date, Exit Code, and Exit Date;

Steps for Data Quality Control

1. Completeness
2. Consistency
3. Accuracy
4. Duplication

Consistency

- Is the information that has been entered aligned and are of same values?
 - **Example 1:** Standardized tests (e.g. Tests of Adult Basic Education (TABE), CUNY Assessment Test (CAT))
 - **Example 2:** Time Consistency

Steps for Data Quality Control

1. Completeness
2. Consistency
3. Accuracy
4. Duplication

Accuracy

- Outliers
 - Are outliers present due to data entry errors or are they valid outliers?
 - Example: Birthday and age

- Plausible Values
 - Are the values entered valid or are they data entry errors?
 - Example: Number of hours working per week

Steps for Data Quality Control

1. Completeness
2. Consistency
3. Accuracy
4. Duplication

Duplication

- Multiple Enrollment
 - One individual enroll in different programs at different colleges
- Duplicate entries (i.e. case notes)
 - Ensure that entries are unique

Submit Data Review

- Data is thoroughly reviewed quarterly –
 - Manually review data in addition to the automated checks
 - Send feedback to the colleges & users
- Results in clean data for reporting & marketing

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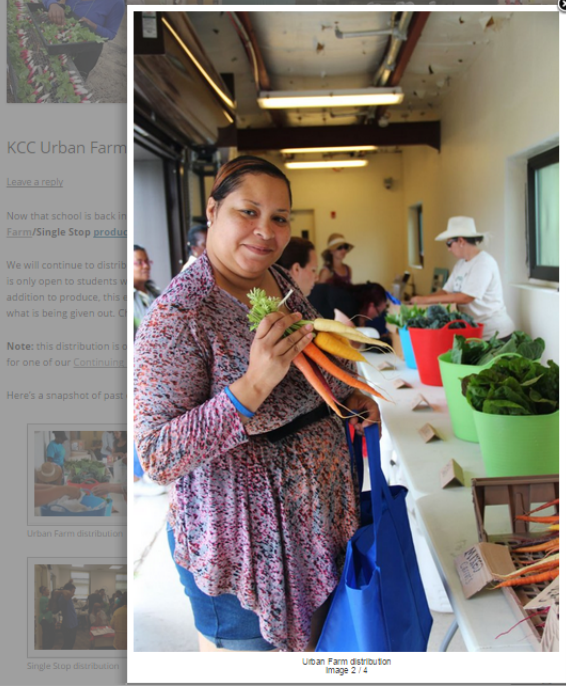

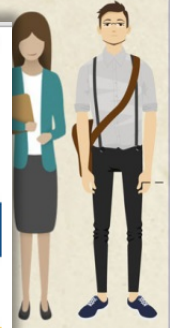
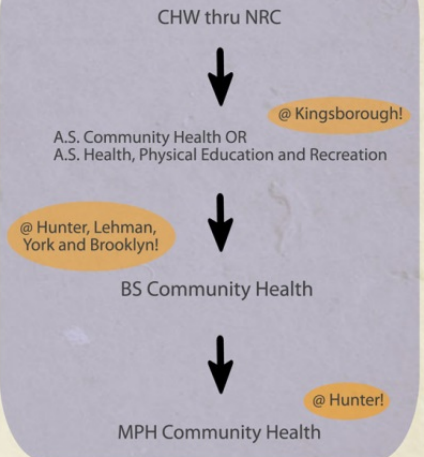
